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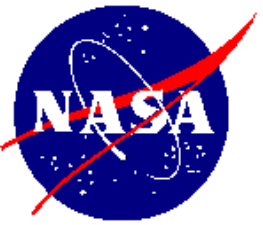
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# Construction Safety Report: 01 February – 08 February 2019

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## Findings: 1

### Level 1 Severity : 1

(Corrected on the spot)

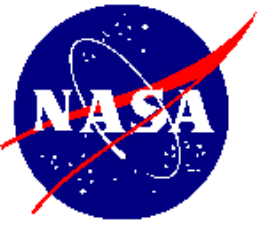
**Fitness Center Expansion:** On 02-01-19, a contractor failed to complete a daily equipment inspection prior to starting work. Ref: 29CFR1926.601 (b)(14) SHEtrak ID # 91238. Closed

### Level 2 Severity : 0

(Corrective action documented)

### Mishaps: 1 / Close Calls: 0

**Natural Gas Project:** The contractor was performing an excavation to locate an underground natural gas valve at the Trent Lott Parkway entrance to the 8100 area and struck a 1.5 inch branch line off the 10 inch main. As a precautionary measure, traffic was interrupted on TL Parkway. The shops responded and cut the gas off, installed a steel plug, and then re-energized the main line. Permanent repairs were completed. SSC 1627 and NMIS reports have been submitted.

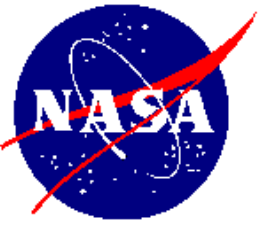

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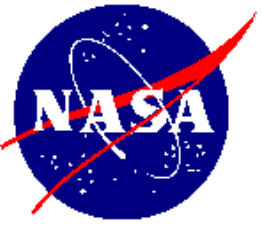

## Mishaps: 1 / Close Calls: 0

**Electrical Repairs Canal Lock Controls:** During probing and excavating activities while looking for a power line (which had been identified by S-3 utility locates but was not on the drawings,) the contractor struck a 2 inch conduit housing a 110volt electrical line and several communication camera video lines. Securadyne responded and revealed that though the conduit was broken, the internal wires were not severed. There was no interruption of power or video camera capabilities. The General Contractors (GC) electrical contractor made repairs and Securadyne verified repairs were acceptable. The case was reported in NMIS and the GC submitted an SSC Form 1627.

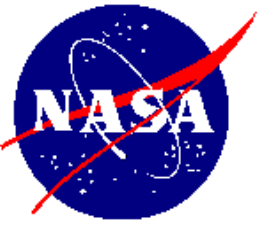

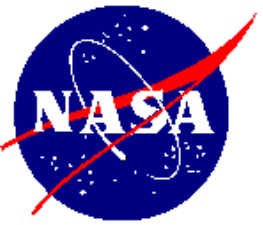
10. Personal Protective and Lifesaving Equipment—Eye and Face Protection: 1926.102, with 1,536 violations

7. Powered Industrial Trucks: 1910.178, with 2,294 violations
6. Ladders: 1926.1053, with 2,812 violations
5. Lockout/ Tag out: 1910.147, with 2,944 violations
4. Respiratory Protection: 1910.134, with 3,118 violations
3. Scaffolds—General Requirements: 1926.451, with 3,336 violations
2. Hazard Communication: 1910.1200, with 4,552 violations
1. Fall Protection—General Requirements: 1926.501, with 7,720 violations

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- **Review all SDS's: Compare electronic data sheets to see if there have been any updates**  
**Cover letter to state 2019 annual review was completed**
- **All fire extinguishers to have 2019 annual service inspection and if due, 6 year maintenance**
- **Review any or all Forklift licenses for any 2019 expiration**
- **Up date LOTO training and certs for 2019**
- **Up date Confined Space training and certs for 2019**
- **Review staff for Gulf Coast Safety Council refresher training. (2 years from date of issue)**
