# **Grounds for Safety**

### Groundskeepers use much powered machinery

- They use mowers, trimmers, tillers, chippers
- The machines slice grass, branches, soil
- They also slice fingers and toes
- They propel chips and stones
- Particles fly faster than eyes can blink

### You can use powered machinery safely:

- Wear safety-toed footwear
- Wear safety eyewear
- Gloves protect hands from many hazards
- They protect hands from vibration
- Keep them away from rotating machinery

# You may have to fix equipment jams

You might need to adjust equipment

- Turn it off before reaching in
- Have all moving parts stopped?
- Unplug electrical equipment
- Gasoline-powered? Remove spark plug

Fuel equipment before you start work

Wait until it cools before refueling

Is equipment running on electricity?

Use approved cords and outlets

Protect the cord from damage

# **Groundskeeping may include driving tractors**

- Get training before trying
- Put it in neutral before starting engine
- Run tractors up and down hills
- Avoid driving across the slopes

#### Protect yourself from the sun

- Wear light clothing and sunscreen
- Wear a brimmed hat and sunglasses
- Heat illness can kill. Drink water often
- Eat lightly salted snacks
- Take breaks in the shade

#### Overhead power lines kill workers

- Many never even noticed the lines
- Beware touching a line with a ladder
- Or with shears, a branch or pole
- Irrigation pipes can hit power lines
- A truck box also allows electrocution

#### Landscaping has other hazards

- They include fertilizers and pesticides
- Insects and snakes may be poisonous
- Stonework could fall or roll on you
- Rotating power takeoffs can crush
