WHAT'S AT STAKE

- Work around construction sites
- Staying safe near heavy mobile machines takes attention and effort even if you don't operate equipment

WHAT'S THE DANGER



- Encounters with heavy equipment have killed many pedestrians and motorists
- Most heavy equipment has a blind spot
- Passerby doesn't stand a chance

Safety Talks! GULETUUCTUUL ELLETY

WHAT'S THE DANGER



- Also a chance of being struck by the load
- A swinging hook on a hoist, or debris falling, can cause a fatal head injury
- Chance of getting caught between two pieces of heavy equipment

EXAMPLE:

- Steam-cleaning a scraper used in street paving
- Left in raised position
- The apron fell, and the employee was caught between the apron and cutting edge of the scraper bowl and killed

HOW TO PROTECT YOURSELF

- Never hitch a ride on heavy equipment
- Only if there's a seat and seatbelt
- Never ride on any part of the equipment not designed for human occupancy




HOW TO PROTECT YOURSELF



- Never walk under an elevated load
- Always wear the required hardhat

HOW TO PROTECT YOURSELF

 Know the correct hand signals

HOW TO PROTECT YOURSELF



- During refueling of heavy equipment, stop all engines
- Don't smoke
- Don't do any work which could ignite fuel vapors

HOW TO PROTECT YOURSELF



Be alert to backup alarms

Operators and bystanders should remember: the danger zone of heavy equipment includes the area reached by any attachment and by the load.
